How The Regional Newspaper Sees Us

Not surprisingly, it's mostly on bridge as this is what hits the eye immediately upon entering the Grand Palais. However, our readers may well have made observations of a similar type as many of them might be not too familiar with the intricacies of bridge itself (Ed.)

Over now to La Voix Du Nord:

A Voyage To The Heart Of The Grey Cells

World Mind Sports Games in Lille: 2,000 Brains Are Storming

It's something like the Olympics for grey cells. It's called World Mind Sports Games and it's staged in the Grand Palais, Lille, until August 23. There are about 2,000 players present, coming from about 140 countries, to compete in bridge, go, chess, draughts and xiangqi. Not to be missed!

North-South, East-West. Just as at a bridge table, the players at the World Games have come from all four compass directions. If you walk through the alleys of the Grand Palais these days, you will be convinced immediately. It feels as if you are in an olympic village with a few silver temples as a bonus. Here, the conversations are lively. People are discussing their games in all the languages of a typical Tower of Babel. Luckily, the shirts they are wearing, in the colours of their nations, are there to help the visitors who have lost track.

These two lovely ladies with their pronounced cheekbones and charming dresses are Russians. Nel Vorster, on her part, wears the colours of South Africa. She says: "I have come here from Pretoria to play bridge. It is such a wonderful game. Before I came to Lille, I have profited from being around by making a touristical roundtrip. I love France. I have only one problem: I don't manage to understand the menu cards in French." Don't worry Nel:We have the same problem, from time to time...

José Damiani, President of IMSA, is the Chief Organizer of the event. "The first edition of this event took place in Beijing in 2008. The idea was to be part of the Olympic cycle: the same year and in the same country." Alas, it has not been possible to stage the event in Great Britain, as was originally intended. So a replacement had to be found. The City of Lille then presented itself as a candidate. "Anyway, Lille is a retreat basis for the Olympic games. In 1998, we organised here a World Bridge Championship, which was a tremendous success with over 5,000 players participating."

Bridge, Chess, Draughts, Go, XiangQi: this time there are "only" about 2,000 players. José Damiani continues: "Lille Grand Palais is a perfectly adequate venue for these Games. We have a different game on each floor here."

With about 1,500 players, bridge is by far the most important part of these games – it has to be admitted. To the great pleasure of hotels and restaurants in the capital of the Flanders Region, who suddenly see an unexpected manna falling from heaven onto them, in the middle of August. José Damiani smiles: "One might say we have sort of invaded the city…"

Alain Rajim, a bridge player who lives near Lille, then takes over from the IMSA President. He is trying (a little in vain) to explain the subtleties of his favourite game to us. Fiftytwo cards, four players and therefore four compass points, 13 cards per player and a bidding sequence to establish the number of tricks a side thinks to score on the deal in progress. "You have to concentrate very well. This is asking for an analytical mind, good physical condition and a good memory. There are billions and billions of possible combinations."

Apart from these combinations, the World Mind Sports Games also open the road to the unexpected. This is what comes to one's mind when one sees both the Palestinian and the Israeli Team in the same room. Assaf Lengy, a player from Tel Aviv, confirms: "We play against everyone without any problem. It is true that sometimes, certain countries like for example Iran refuse to play against us. But in general, bridge makes it possible for people from the countries involved to meet after all."

The Egyptian player Abd-El-Saam Saaid immediately agrees: "It is no problem at all. The Israeli players are nice people. It's only a political problem. It is difficult to become really close friends but that's the way it is." About Egypt's chances as the tournament progresses, he gives us some good advice: "If you really want to bet, don't put your money on us. Rather try Italy, Monaco, USA or The Netherlands." Still, we will put a dime on Egypt as well. This is our way to bring together the four compass points. In our region of France, le Nord (the North).
